Sub:- Application dated 28.04.2015 of the Secretary, Chitragupta Social Welfare and Educational Society (Regd.), R-3/54, Raj Nagar, District- Ghaziabad -201001, Uttar Pradesh to establish a new Ayurveda College in the name of “Sri Ram Ayurvedic Medical College and Hospital, Vill.- Dungrawali, Partapur Bye-Pass Road (Delhi- Haridwar Highway), District-Meerut -250103, Uttar Pradesh” with 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course under Section 13A of the IMCC ACT, 1970 from the academic session 2016-17 – Permission Letter for 60 UG seats (instead of 100 seats)-regarding.

Sir,

In continuation to the Ministry's letter of even No. dated 09.03.2016 wherein a Letter of Intent was issued to the Society to establish a new Ayurvedic college in the name of “Sri Ram Ayurvedic Medical College and Hospital, Vill.- Dungrawali, Partapur Bye-Pass Road (Delhi-Haridwar Highway), District-Meerut -250103, Uttar Pradesh” with 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course with respect to the proposal submitted to the Central Government as cited above, I am directed to say that after careful consideration of the recommendations & report of the CCIM in terms of criteria as specified in the Regulations 3 and 10 of the Indian Medicine Central Council (Minimum Standard Requirements of Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2012 read with amendment Regulations of 2013, provisions under the IMCC Act, 1970, relevant regulations made thereunder and as per approval of the Hon'ble MoS (IC), Ministry of AYUSH for the UG/PG course(s) for grant of conditional permission for the academic session 2016-17 vide Ministry's letters No.R.11011/01/2016-EP (IM-1) dated 12.08.2016 & 31.08.2016 (available on Ministry's website <indianmedicine.nic.in>); permission of the Central Government is hereby granted to the Secretary, Chitragupta Social Welfare and Educational Society (Regd.), R-3/54, Raj Nagar, District- Ghaziabad -201001, Uttar Pradesh to establish a new Ayurveda College in the name of “Sri Ram Ayurvedic Medical College and Hospital, Vill.- Dungrawali, Partapur Bye-Pass Road (Delhi- Haridwar Highway), District-Meerut -250103, Uttar Pradesh” with intake capacity of 60 seats in BAMS (UG) course (instead of 100 seats, due to non-availability of few faculty members, the applicant has requested to grant permission for 60 seats only instead of 100 seats and the CCIM has also recommended for 60 seats) from the academic session 2016-17 under the provisions of the section 13A of the IMCC Act, 1970. Therefore, the college may take admissions for 60 seats in BAMS (UG) course for the academic session 2016-17 subject to the condition that the following requirements should be fulfilled by the college positively by the 31st December, 2016 to get conditional permission for the session 2017-18 (a copy of Assessment sheet of CCIM is also enclosed):

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- (i) The college shall obtain the NABH accreditation for the Hospital within one year and the NAAC accreditation for the College within two years from the issuance of the permission letter and the college shall submit its compliance to this Ministry as well as to the CCIM within specified period;
 - (ii) Relevant provisions of the Minimum Standards Requirements of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in Regulation 3 and Regulation 10 of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Minimum Standard Requirements of Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospital) Regulations, 2012 read with amendment Regulations of 2013 by 31st December 2016, to get conditional permission for the session 2017-18;
 - (iii) Relevant requirements under the Indian Medicine Central Council (Minimum Standards of Education in Indian Medicine) (Amendment) Regulations, 2012 read with amendment Regulations of 2013 (for UG Ayurveda).
2. The college administration will ensure that sufficient qualified teachers and non-teaching staff in the college and requisite staff in the hospital, as per the relevant CCIM Regulations, are in position before the admission of the first batch of students in the 1st professional of BAMS course is made, under intimation to the Central Government and CCIM.
 3. The college has to develop the requisite infrastructure for IInd, IIIrd and IVth professionals well in time as per the CCIM norms which will be verified and reported by the CCIM at least three months before the start of next professional and accordingly, the permission for taking admissions in subsequent academic session will be issued.
 4. The college administration may take up the matter for recognition of the qualification under section 14(2) of the IMCC Act, 1970 at that time when the first batch of students admitted against this course appears for the first final professional examination of the said course.
 5. Please acknowledge the receipt of this letter.
 6. This issues with the approval of competent authority.
